- long-term capacity



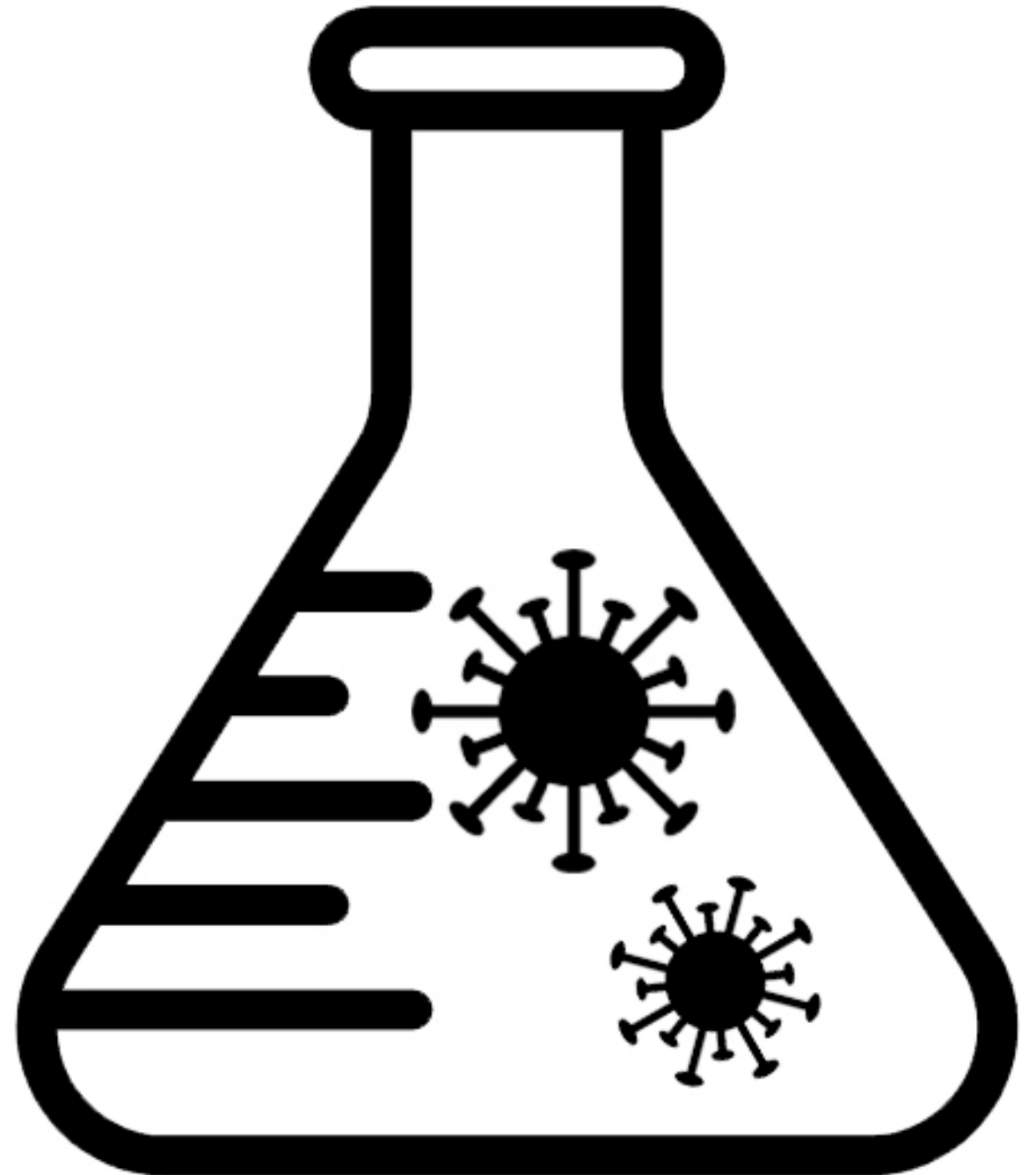
Identify best practices that should be institutionalized
